## Liberty Hall

Inspired by White House architect James Hoban's Public Audience Chamber (now known as the East Room), Liberty Hall hosts convocations, public events, as well as wedding receptions. When John and Abigail Adams moved to the White House in 1800, Abigail hung her laundry in the great unfinished room.

Your Luncheon hostess is First Lady Dolley Madison. In 1814, Dolly Madison saved the large painting of George Washington at great personal risk to herself and escaped just before the British burned down the White House. She will recount this and other stories from her days as First Lady.



## The National Veterans Shrine and Register of Honor

The National Veterans Shrine is patterned after Philadelphia's Carpenters Hall. The Shrine honors our veterans' service and sacrifice for America and its freedom. It features major sculpture and paintings by nationally-renowned artists. Interactive media, artifacts and exhibits will help answer the questions: "Who are our country's veterans?" "What did they do for our country?" and "What do we owe them?"

Housed within the Shrine is the Veterans Register of Honor, a website and database containing photographs, biographical sketches, and stories of America's veterans and active members of the United States Armed Forces.
