Frequently Asked Questions

Which programs are best suited for my students?

All of our educational programs are very engaging and inspiring for students. This catalog is divided by grade level, kindergarten through high school. You can easily scan the program options for each grade to see which ones fit the needs of your class.

What does it cost?

Program fee is \$10 in advance for each student and chaperone, \$11 onsite. RESERVATIONS REQUIRED.

What should we expect?

American Village programs are carefully structured so that students become part of a "revolutionary experience" that is designed to teach and inspire. Programs run from one and a half to three hours.

Living America's Story Patriots

Appropriate for Kindergarten through Grade 3



Young colonists take action! Be brave and muster your courage to be engaged to help our country on the "Road to Revolution."

You may be asked to row across the Charles River or ride with Paul Revere to warn the colonists that the British are coming. There could be a "tea party" in Boston and patriots may even become "spies" as they relay secret messages.

Students are encouraged to wear mob caps and tricorn hats.

Living America's Story Thanksgiving

Appropriate for Kindergarten through Grade 3



Travel on the Mayflower to the new world; make peace with Chief Massasoit, a Native American tribal chief who befriends the colonists; play harvest games on the green and participate in the first Thanksgiving Feast.

Living America's Story Presidents

Appropriate for Kindergarten through Grade 3



Meet President George Washington, King George, and get ready to play the game show, "Choose Your George". Students will also put together a puzzle of Lincoln's life story and develop a greater understanding of what it is like to be the President of the United States of America as they learn about the many duties and "hats" the President wears.

Students participate in a variety of activities and games tied directly to traditions begun by presidents and first ladies.

Students may dress like their favorite President or First Lady.

Independence!

Appropriate for Intermediate Grades 4-5, Middle School Grades 6-8 and High School Grades 9-12



Independence! is the newest program at the American Village, and includes a trip to the West Wing of Independence Hall. This building features an immersive exhibition space and a multi-sensory theater, designed to fully engage students in the struggle for American independence.

An opening play takes place just outside the Courthouse. Students then travel to the West Wing of Independence Hall, where they are transported back to revolutionary Boston on the eve of Paul Revere's ride. In the foyer, the Liberty Tree narrates an immersive experience that includes the Boston wharf where the Boston Tea Party took place, the Green Dragon Tavern where the Sons of Liberty met to form plans for gaining independence from Great Britain, the Boston Custom House and Mercantile, where students learn about taxation and shortages of goods, the Boston State House which features a state-of-the-art digital animation of the Boston Massacre, and the Old North Church where the signal was sent "one if by land, two if by sea" warning colonists that the British soldiers were on the march.

From the foyer, students move into the multi-sensory theater, where they see an original film that takes them on a journey from Paul Revere's ride to the battles at Lexington and Concord, to the Continental Congress. Along the way they will be introduced to George Washington, Benjamin Franklin, Samuel Adams, John Adams, John Hancock, Abigail Adams, Phillis Wheatley, Thomas Jefferson, Crispus Attucks, and many other historic figures from America's founding generation.



In addition to the experience in the West Wing of Independence Hall, students take part in the Yorktown Encampment, attend the 5th Virginia Convention and argue for independence, become members of the Boston Sons of Liberty, and carry a secret message vital to the patriots' cause.

Independence! is aligned with Alabama Course of Study standards and supplements regular classroom instruction intended to meet those standards. It is the best choice of programming for students in grades four through twelve, apart from special programs designed for and targeted to more specific topics and age groups from time to time.

The program is consistent in subject matter for all grades, appealing to a broad spectrum of students and attending to multiple, active learning styles; however, delivery is differentiated for three age groupings:

• intermediate grades 4-5 • middle school grades 6-8 • high school grades 9-12

Content understanding is differentiated on the basis of vocabulary and concept difficulty. Modifications are made in the use of authentic language, use of examples and analogies, use of visual and auditory support, degree of presentation detail, connection to accessible and relevant student background and experience, connection to previous classroom instruction, and in pacing.

The program also seeks to evoke a sense of ownership and stewardship of the principles of liberty and self-government. In this regard, program delivery is differentiated on the basis of age, maturity level and civic experience. Students will participate in the struggle for American independence and the continuing journey to fulfill the promises of liberty and equality. It is a compelling story, and your students are a part of it!

Program dates: September 2-6, 10-13, 16-20, 23-27, 30-31; October 1-4, 7-11, 14-18; December 2-6; January 14-17, 21-24, 27-31; February 3-7; March 3-7, 10-14, 17-21, 24-28; April 14-17, 21-25, 28-31; May 1-2, 5-9, 12-16, 19-23.

American Village Youth Program



Each year 25 students in grades 7 through 12 who are interested in fine arts performance and history are competitively chosen to participate in American Village summer programming. These Junior Interpreters assist our professional educational interpreters to help immerse thousands of visitors in customs and times of the 18th century. Junior Interpreters receive professional training, conduct colonial games on the green, and participate in various historical vignettes.

Training takes place in late May and early June. Attendance is mandatory. Participants must commit to a minimum of two days per week over the summer.

Program fee: No fee; purchase of 18th Century costume required.
